1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

The **XVII MiniEuropa 2021** will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2018, the ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules Singles & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2018 as well as all pertinent ISU Communications and valid decisions of the ISU Congress 2018.

Participation in the **XVII MiniEuropa 2021** is open to all competitors who belong to an ISU Member, Rule 109, paragraph 1, and qualify with regard to eligibility, according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3. a) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2030. Passports of the skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be presented at the accreditation.

3. ENTRIES

3.1 Entries of Competitors

4. EXPENSES, MEALS, LODGING

The expenses for rooms, meals and travel for the competitors, coaches, team leaders and other team officials will not be covered by the organizer and are on the account of the teams.

5. MUSIC/ PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

All Competitors shall furnish competition music of excellent quality on CD, in accordance with Rule 343, paragraph 1. All CD must show the Competitor's name, the Nation and the exact running time of the music (not skating time) including any starting signal and must be submitted at the time of registration. Each program (short program, free skating) must be recorded on one track and on a separate CD. In addition competitors must provide a back-up CD for each program.

With the entry forms, the "Program Content Sheet" must return to the Organizing Committee in time,
